

Small Group Discussion Guide

(1 Timothy 6: 11-16)

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. You might want to go around and share personal prayer requests for the coming year: something specific you sense God is leading you to do.

I. As we finish off our study series on I Timothy, the Apostle Paul once again exhorts Timothy to obey his command without exceptions. (Note <u>1 Tim.</u> 6:13-14). Now go back and read <u>1 Tim.</u> 6:11-12.

Lets single out three imperatives to be in this passage.

- 1. FLEE: What is Timothy to run away from? (Note verses 9-10). How might money be a stumbling block in the ministry? Be specific! According to 2 Tim. 2:22, 1 Cor. 6:18 and 1 Cor. 10:14, what else are we to flee from?
 - a. Why doesn't God instruct us to stand and fight these things?
 - b. Any examples?
- 2. PURSUE: In <u>1 Tim. 6:11</u> Paul instructs Timothy to run away from wickedness but to run towards righteousness. Explain how each of these six areas is worthy pursuits fro a Christian.
 - a. Why might the last two be especially helpful for leaders who are helping others?
 - b. What does pursuing love look like?
 - c. What kind of love?
- 3. FIGHT: Explain, "The good fight of the faith."
 - a. Who are we fighting? (Eph. 6:12).
