



## Small Group Discussion Guide Isaac

*Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer.*

- I. In the Abrahamic Covenant, God promised Abraham a land, a nation and blessings. Sarah decides that they better go with “Plan B,” ([Gen. 16:1-2](#)) and Ishmael is born.
  - a. Read [Genesis 17:15-22](#). Isaac would be called “the Son of Promise.”
    - i. How does Paul relate this to us today in [Galatians 4:28-29](#)?
      1. In what sense are we “born of the Spirit?”
- II. Now read [Genesis 22:1-19](#).
  - a. Why do you suppose God was testing Abraham?
  - b. Why does God test us today?
    - i. Note [James 1:2-4](#), [1 Peter 4:12-19](#).
  - c. Abraham passes the test. ([Hebrews 11:17-19](#))
    - i. What does God do?
    - ii. How does this event prefigure Calvary?
- III. Now read [Genesis 26:1-6](#). God confirms His covenant with Isaac.
  - a. What does He command Isaac to do, and what does God promise to do for him?
- IV. Every generation must have its own encounter with God. God initiates a relationship with Isaac just like He did with his father Abraham.
  - a. Take a few minutes to share as a group. Who in your group had God honoring parents?
    - i. How did God reach you through their example?
    - ii. Does having Christian parents insure that the kids will be Christians? Explain.
    - iii. Can God reach the children of non-Christians? How?

*Close your time by praying that God will reach this new generation. Ask Him how He could use you to promote faith in your children or grandchildren’s lives.*



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
