

Small Group Discussion Guide Jacob

Take time to share prayer concerns and updates as a group. Ask God to speak to each heart and mind as you study His word together.

- I. Today we shift our attention from Isaac to his son Jacob.
 - a. Read Genesis 25:19-28.
 - i. What kind of relationship does God foretell for the twins?
 - ii. How are they named at birth?
 - iii. How does parental partiality create problems for kids *(verse 28)*?
 - 1. Any examples?
- II. Read *Genesis* 25:29-34.
 - a. What is a birthright, and what does it entitle the first-born?
 - b. Explain how Esau despised his birthright (verse 34, Hebrews 12:16).
 - c. What rights and privileges do we inherit now as God's children?
 - i. (Note *Romans 8:14-17*).
- III. Read Genesis 27:1-4.
 - a. It was customary for fathers to bless their children before they died.
 - i. What does this involve?
 - ii. Why did Isaac call Esau and not Jacob?
 - iii. Does this custom carry over today?
- IV. Now read Genesis 27:5-29.
 - a. Rebekah is positioning Jacob to receive the oldest son's blessing. (Remember what God told her in *Genesis 25:23*.)
 - i. Reread Isaacs blessing in verses 27-29.
 - 1. What kinds of things does he declare for his son?
 - 2. How does he reemphasize Abraham's covenant when he sends Jacob off in *Genesis 28:1-5*?
- V. Finally, read *Genesis 27:30-45*.
 - a. What can you learn about the power of a father's blessing in this passage?
 - i. What affect did this incident have on Esau?
 - ii. What applications can we draw for parents today and the way they speak to (bless) their kids? (Note *Prov. 18:21*, *Col. 3:21*).

Close your group by praying for parents who are presently raising children. Ask God to help you to regularly bless your children in a way that affirms their value and potential in the Lord.



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
