"The Gospel of Mark"
Week of March 18, 2018

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to use your study to strengthen your knowledge of God and your love for him.

- I. Today we will look at two accounts of Jesus sending his disciples out on "mission trips". We send groups to Tijuana each year. Why? What are some of the fruits of church mission trips? Anyone have a personal example to share?
- II. Read <u>Mark 6:7-13</u>. Review this text. What strategy did Jesus use here? Why the limitations on extra things? What lessons do you think Jesus wanted his disciples to learn on this trip? Read <u>Mark 6:30</u>. What kind of report do you suppose the disciples gave Jesus? How would this trip have affected them personally? Is this true for our church mission trips as well?
- III. Now read *Luke 10:1-12*. Who else went on this second trip? What new instructions does Jesus add? What exactly is "a man of peace" in verse 6? Why could this concept help us reach unchurched people today? Finally, how could the prayer in verse 2 be a model prayer for us to regularly pray at Bethel Gilead?
