Week of April 2, 2018

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to speak to your group through the study of his word and the work of his spirit.

- I. Today we will pick up back in Mark, chapter eight. Read <u>Mark</u> <u>8:27-30</u>. How do people tend to answer the question today, "Who is Jesus"? What are the options for someone who claims divinity? How can you judge his claims as true or false? Are there other religious leaders who claimed to be more then simply "human"? How do we judge their claims?
- II. John the Baptist believed in Jesus as the Son of God, but then doubted. Read <u>Luke 7:18-28</u>. Why was John doubting Jesus? Can you relate? Any personal examples of when you had serious doubts? How did Jesus answer John's question about him? Note_<u>Isaiah 61:1-3</u>. How can we help a fellow believer overcome doubt?
- III. Finish the text. Read <u>Mark 8:31-33</u>. Jesus clarifies Messiah's mission. How did Peter take it and why the misunderstanding? How can we help people understand the gospel today, people who have in mind "the things of men", worldly things? Note <u>2 Corinthians</u> <u>4:1-6</u>.
