Week of April 15, 2018

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to sharpen your understanding of his will for us as a church.

- I. Take a few minutes to review the 40 Day Prayer Guide. How's it going so far? What day/verse has been especially meaningful to you this past week? Do you sense God is trying to do something specific in your life at this time? How is prayer related to that? In what ways could this prayer campaign be beneficial and strategic for all the churches in Branch County?
- II. Today, let's pick up our reading in Mark, Chapter 10. Read <u>Mark 10:17-22</u>. What impresses you about this story? The text says that Jesus loved this man. He seemed like a righteous and sincere Jew. Did Jesus turn him away? Why do you suppose the 10 Commandments were not enough? Why did Jesus center in on his riches? Should we be ready to give all our wealth away too? Explain your answers.
- III. Now read <u>Mark 10:23-27</u>. What is the meaning of a camel passing through a needle, and why is it so hard for the wealthy to enter God's kingdom? How does Jesus pacify the disciples? In what sense is your salvation impossible for you, but possible for God? Note <u>Romans 3:21-28</u>.
- IV. Finally, read <u>Mark 10:28-31</u>. What exactly is Jesus trying to explain in this passage? In what ways are we paid back a hundred times more in this life? And, what about persecution? Is this promise meant for the early disciples or for us as well? Any examples?
