## Setting:

Bethlehem ("Land of Bread")
Moab (decedent of Lot, forbidden to marry).

## Characters:

Elimelek-father ("My God is King")
Naomi-mother ("Pleasant," later denies her name and says 'no, call be bitterness.")
Mahlon-son, husband of Ruth (weak, sick or wounded and soon dies)
Kilion-son, husband to Orpah (pining, wasting away and soon dies)
Ruth the Moabite, widow to Mahlon remarries to Boaz (comrade, friend)
Oprah a Moabite, widow to Kilion (gazelle or stiff neck)
Boaz-close relative to Naomi, marries Ruth (in strength or by strength)
Yahweh: Proper name of God (does not speak, personal and providential)

## Literary Techniques:

Situation Irony, the author creates a situation in which actions have an effect that is contrary to what was expected.
Charactonym, a name especially for a fictional character that suggests a distinctive trait of the character.
