Does Science Disprove God?

Science is a Limited Field

Definition: Science is the systematic study of the natural world through observation and experimentation.

"Hard Sciences"....."Soft Sciences"

Math, biology, chemistry, physics, geology, astronomy Psychology, sociology, an philosophy, metaphysics Psychology, sociology, anthropology,

"Science can improve personal life for a scientist but science cannot improve the personality of the scientist."

*Science cannot prove "the basic constants" of the universe.

*It cannot prove past events.

*It cannot answer the deepest questions of human existence in terms of identity, purpose and destiny.

*Science cannot solve problems of ethics, morality, beauty, love, hatred, pride.

*Science cannot prove or disprove God.

Faith is objective. It rests on evidences revealed by God.

- 1. God's World (*Psalm* 19:1-4, *Romans* 1:18-20)
- 2. God's Word (*Matthew 24:35*, 2 Peter 1:19-21)
- 3. God's Son -- "The Living Word" (John 1:1-3,14)

III. Are miracles anti-scientific?

Definition: A miracle is a supernatural interruption in the natural order.

(ex) Albert Einstein -- Flatland

*The 4th Dimension - supernatural/spiritual reality
