

Small Group discussion Guide God's Story: Abraham

Take time for sharing and prayers. Ask God to show you someone who is struggling with their faith that you could bring to hear Robert Rogers speak on Sunday April 24th.

- I. We go from creation, the fall and the flood to the topic of redemption.
 - a. Read Gen. 12:1-4.
 - i. God speaks to Abram. What does He tell him to do?
 - ii. What does God promise to do for Abram?
 - iii. How does Abram respond, (vs. 4, Heb. 11:8).
 - iv. How old was Abram when God called him?
 - v. When are we too old (or too young) to serve God?
 - vi. What other excuses do we tend to make for not responding to God's call?
 - b. There's a basic spiritual principle here: God initiates and we respond.
 - i. What did God initiate with Adam and Eve?
 - ii. How did they respond?
 - iii. What did God initiate with Noah?
 - iv. How does he respond?
 - v. What is God initiating here with Abram?
 - vi. How does Abram respond?
- II. Read <u>Genesis 15:1-6</u>: God speaks to Abram a second time.
 - a. What does He mean by being our shield?
 - b. What does He mean by being our great reward?
 - c. How can knowing God this way dispel fear?
 - i. Note: *Psalm 46:1-3*
 - d. What does God promise Abram in verses 4-5?
 - i. How does Abram respond? (v.6)
 - e. What principle does Paul teach from this account in *Rom. 4:1-5*?
 - f. According to <u>Rom. 4:16-25</u>, how does Abram's blessing apply to us today as Christians?
 - g. What response does God require from us in order to be right with Him?
 - i. What does He promise us when we trust in Christ?

God initiates, we respond! Close your group by asking God to help each of you to respond in faith to what God has done for you through Christ, as well as to what God is wanting to do in your life in the days ahead.



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
