Share some ways that we can keep our material possessions from hindering our walk with God. How might God reward us if we do (verses 29-30)
- III. Finally, skip over and read *Luke 18:35-43*. What impresses you about blind Bartimaeus? What significance does the title "Son of David" have? How did this man know who Jesus was, he'd never seen him before? What principles about faith can we gleen from this story?
