*Open with prayer. Ask God to encourage your faith through the study of his word.* 

I. Today let's look at two parables of Christ that deal with Jesus' second coming and the end of the age.

Read *Luke 19:11-27*. According to verse one, what's the context of Jesus' parable? Who might the master and the servants represent in the story? At what point in history will God reward the faithful and punish the wicked? Reread verse 26. What do you think Jesus means to say in this verse?

II. Next read <u>*Luke 20:9-18.</u>* Summarize the story. How is it alike and different from the previous parable? What does the vineyard represent and who does the owner send to the tenants? How do they treat them?</u>

III. Now read *Luke 20:19*. The religious leaders were out to get Jesus. They are the tenants of the vineyard who killed the prophets up until Christ's day. Read *Luke 20:1-8*. Where is Jesus' authority coming from? How has he proved this throughout his ministry? Why haven't the religious leaders believed in him yet?

\*Human nature hasn't changed much since Jesus' time. Plenty of people continue to doubt Jesus to this very day. Can we do anything to change their minds? Be specific.

Close your group by asking God to make us better witnesses to the people around us each day.
