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Small Group Discussion  
*God's Story: [David](#)*

Nov. 14-18

*Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Take time to share what you are particularly thankful for this Thanksgiving.*

- I. Today let's revisit the age old favorite Bible Story of David and Goliath. Begin by reading [1 Samuel 17: 1-11](#). King Saul and his army are at a standoff with the Philistines. The enemy presents their version of Hulk Hogan named Goliath. What is his challenge and how do the Israelites respond? What Goliath-sized challenges commonly invoke fear in God's people today?
- II. Read [1 Samuel 17:12-26](#). David heard and saw exactly what the rest of Saul's army saw. What was his response to Goliath's taunting? How did his faith affect his perspective? How would you reword the last part of verse 26?
- III. Read [1 Samuel 17:27-36](#). Whose reputation was David more concerned about? What had God already done for him before that battle? Personal experience often breeds confidence. Should we stand up to those in our society who defy God's reputation and glory? Explain your answer.
- IV. Read [1 Samuel 17:37-52](#) What is your favorite part of this story? Why do you suppose David chose five stones instead of just one? According to [verses 45 and 47](#), what was David's true weapon of war? What impact did his victory over Goliath have on the rest of the army? What principles for facing our own fears today can you draw from this Old Testament account?

Close your group by asking God for deeper convictions of who he really is and what he can really do in and through us when we wholeheartedly trust and honor him.



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
