Small Group Discussion Guide

week of 02/06/17

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to work in each heart as you study his word and apply it to your lives.

We've recently looked at the ministries of Elijah and Elisha -- prophets sent to call Israel away from idols and back to God. Today, let's look at the king who led all of Israel astray.

- I. The Northern tribes turn away from King Rehoboam, Solomon's son, and choose Jeroboam as their new king. Right away things go bad in Israel. Read <u>1 Kings</u> <u>12:22-33</u>. List the various sins Jeroboam commits. How do these line up with the warnings God gave Israel previously? Note (<u>Deut. 4:15-19, 25-31</u>).
- II. Jeroboam becomes a standard by which the future kings of Israel will be compared. Note the following examples: 1 Kings 15:33-34, 16:25-26; 22:51-53. How do we tend to judge our political leaders today? Is there ever a time when personal character isn't important in leadership?
- III. Jeroboam replaces temple worship with "open worship", allowing people to worship God as they see fit. Why is this dangerous? Note God's instructions to Israel on how they are to worship him *Exodus 20:22-26; 34:10-28*. According to Paul, what happens to people who ignore God's commands and give in to other religious practices (*Romans 1:18-32*).
- IV. As a group, suggest how we as Christians are to acceptably worship God today. Has he set any standards, rules or boundaries to regulate our worship? Note <u>Hebrews 12:28-13:17</u>. What are the possible consequences of ignoring God's instructions?

Close your group in prayer. Ask God to guard each of you from any kind of false worship. Trust him to lead you to honor Christ each day with sincere attitudes, words and actions that worship him as Lord.



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
