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### Small Group Discussion Guide

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to use your study to draw each group member closer to him and to one another.

- I. We have been looking at some of the kings of Israel. Read <u>Matthew 1:6-11</u>. What do we know about this list of Jesus' ancestors? Where else are they recorded in scripture? Who were considered good kings and who were considered bad from this list?
- II. Now go to the record of King Hezekiah in the book of Kings. Read <u>2 Kings</u>. <u>18:1-8</u>. How is Hezekiah memorialized? What good points of his reign are listed? What do you perceive was the "secret of his success"? Could you imagine how a president like this would come across in America today? How would he be perceived by the public? How was Hezekiah's life fortified by his convictions about who God is? <u>(2 Kings 19:15,19)</u>
- III. Perhaps the only downfall of Hezekiah was his son. Read <u>2 Kings 21:1-9,16</u>. In contrast to Hezekiah, what are the sins of Manasseh? Be specific. How is it possible for a father to be so noble and God fearing and then for his son to be such a scoundrel? Can you give any other examples of this father-son contrast in the Old Testament?

What word of instruction or warning should parents or grandparents take from Hezekiah and Manasseh? What can we do better as a church to help parents raise godly kids in an increasingly ungodly generation? *(Ephesians 6:4)* 

Take a moment to pray for the children or grandchildren represented by the members of your group. Ask God to show you how to help kids avoid the pitfalls of idolatry (godlessness) in our day and age.



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
