Small Group Discussion Guide

"The Gospel of Mark"
Week of February 18, 2018

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to use his word to convince us of the opportunities he has given us to be part of his kingdom.

- I. The Gospel of Mark takes a break from the action in chapter 4 where Mark records three parables of Jesus. What is a parable and why did Jesus use them? Note <u>Mark 4:10-12; 33-34</u>. In what sense do parables illustrate principles about the kingdom of God?
- II. The first parable is commonly referred to as the Sower and the Seed. Read <u>Mark 4:1-9, 13-20</u>. What are the four types of soils and what does each soil represent? What is the seed? Explain how people respond in the four different ways to God's word. Which of the four are Christians? Can a person change from one soil (heart) type to another? Explain your answer. Finally, what's the crop/fruit produced by the good soil? What is meant by thirty, sixty or a hundred fold?
- III. Next, read <u>Mark 4:26-32</u>. What does this parable illustrate? In what sense is the kingdom of God growing like a seed? What grows? How is the second parable different from the first parable? How could this parable encourage us when all around the world seems resistant to God? What do you sense God is doing around the world and not just here in our community? Any examples?
- IV. Finally, read <u>Mark 12:1-12</u>. Why does Jesus tell this parable and who is it about? Why did Jesus quote <u>Psalm 118:22-23</u> to the Pharisees? According to verse 12, did they get the point?

Close your time by praying together the Lord's Prayer. Pay close attention to your words, especially your petition for God's kingdom to come and His will be done on earth (in your life) as in heaven.



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
