Small Group Discussion Guide

(Romans 2)

Week of October 14, 2018

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to open your hearts to the truth of his word and its instruction for your individual lives.

I. In Romans chapter one, we looked at what has gone wrong with the world and why immorality and evil exist. (*Romans 1:18, 21-23*). Let's pick up in chapter two and ask, "What about all the good people in the world, are they also under condemnation?"

Read <u>Romans 2:1-4</u>. Explain how our human nature tends to want to justify itself by comparing ourselves to people who are worse than we are (murderers, robbers, liars, etc.). If we don't do these "bad things", are we equally guilty of sin? (Note <u>Matthew 5:21-22</u>)

- II. Read <u>Romans 2:5-11.</u> God is a fair judge. What does that mean for anyone who has sinned? How about anyone who does everything right? (Note <u>Romans 3:9-12).</u> How will the Lord judge Gentiles who do not know the law of God? Read <u>Romans 2:12-16</u>. According to this passage, what will take place on Judgment Day? Explain why sin is more than just actions, it's a matter of the heart. How does God change our hearts? (Note <u>Ezekiel 36:26-27, 2 Corinthians 4:15-18; 5:17-19)</u>
- III. Now read <u>Romans 2:17-27</u>. Notice the "religious man" assumes that God will accept him by what he does. Do Christians assume they are good enough to merit salvation by their good works? How many of God's laws do we need to break before we are considered "lawbreakers"? Again, notice sin is ultimately an issue of the heart, according to <u>Romans 2:28-29</u>. What role does the Holy Spirit play in making us right with God?

Close your time in prayer by thanking God for the Savior, Jesus Christ. Ask the Holy Spirit to work deep in your heart to sanctify your life and to keep you from temptation and willful sin.



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*In summary, who can be right with God by his own effort? Romans 2 is setting us up! What do we all need?

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
