The Romans Road

The book of Romans clearly presents God's plan of salvation, explaining how someone can be saved, how they can grow in their faith and how they can serve God with their life. Let's take time to examine six verses that you could share with someone who wants to accept Christ.

- I. <u>*Romans 1:16.*</u> How could this verse be used as an introduction to the message of salvation? What does gospel mean? What do people need to be saved from?
- II. <u>*Romans 3:23*</u>. What is sin? How have all people sinned against God? Why is this important for someone to know right from the start of the gospel presentation?
- III. <u>*Romans 5:8.*</u> Why is God's love important here? Would <u>John 3:16</u> help reemphasize this point? How does Christ dying tie into the previous verse (3:23)?
- IV. <u>Romans 6:23.</u> What is the wages of our sin? According to Romans 5:8, who paid our wage for us? Why is salvation a gift and not an earned wage? How do we receive this gift? Note <u>John 1:12.</u>
- V. <u>Romans 10:9-13.</u> What does God want us to confess? What does "Jesus is Lord" signify? How can we help someone personalize that truth? Why is the resurrection important to believe in our hearts? What does God promise everyone who calls upon the Lord? Is prayer a good way to call upon him?
- VI. <u>Romans 12:1-2</u>. How has God show us his mercy? What does living sacrificially for God mean? How does God want us to renew our minds? What is being transformed? What does it mean to test and approve God's will? How is God's will for us described here? How can you help a new Christian get off to a good start?
