## **Small Group Discussion Guide**

Week of February 24, 2019

Open your group by discussing the upcoming <u>Small Group Outreach</u> <u>Project</u>. Review the basic concept of the Kingdom Assignment and begin to discuss the kinds of projects or ideas your group could sponsor. Make no decisions yet. List ideas during the next couple of weeks and ask your group members to begin to pray for direction from God.

- I. As a church, we are discussing Paul's discourse on the nation of Israel, who officially rejected Jesus as their Messiah. Begin by reading <u>Romans 11:1-12</u>. Have all Jews rejected Christ? Who's the remnant? Who might "the elect" be in verse 7? According to verse 11, what has resulted from Israel's "hardening"?
- II. Now read <u>Romans 11:13-24</u>. In what ways might non-believers become envious of believers? Is it ever the other way around? Explain your answers. How are the Jews (Judaism) the roots and we (Christians) the branches? How do we relate to the Old Testament today?
- III. Read <u>Romans 11:25-32</u>. What mystery has Paul addressed in chapters 9, 10 and 11? Why did God choose the nation of Israel to begin with? Note: <u>Deuteronomy 4:5-8, Isaiah 43:10-12, Romans 9:4-5</u>. What hope is there today for Israel? When will the nation finally believe in Jesus as their Messiah? Note <u>2 Thessalonians 2:1-4,8</u>.
- IV. Finish your study by reading the doxology in <u>Romans 11:33-36</u>. What main point is Paul reminding us of in these verses? How could this information encourage us in our daily lives now? Close your group by affirming God's sovereignty. Give him his due glory! Remember, from him and through him and to him are all things!
