Small Group Discussion Guide

Week of March 3, 2019

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. If you have decided to do the <u>Small Group Outreach Project</u>, take some time to share ideas. Don't make any decisions yet. Ask God to direct your thoughts and discussions.

- I. The Apostle Paul turns the focus from the nation of Israel (chapters 9 11) to the third section of Romans -- social relationships and service. Read *Romans 12:1-2*. What does the "therefore" refer back to? How can someone offer his body as a living sacrifice? Explain. What is the pattern of this world? How do we practically renew our minds? Any examples? According to this passage, how can we test God's will for our lives?
- II. Now read <u>Romans 12:3-8</u>. What is a measure of faith? Do we each have one? How much did you get? According to verse 5, who do we belong to as Christians? How should this affect someone's church attendance? Explain how spiritual gifts function in the congregation? Note (<u>1 Corinthians 12:7, 1 Corinthians 13:12, 26</u>) List the gifts mentioned in verses 6-8. Explain how each one could be used to benefit other Christians
- III. Finally, read <u>Romans 12:9-16</u>. How does this passage instruct us to live together as Christians? Which verse speaks "loudest" to you personally? Which is most needed in our churches today? <u>Verses 17-21</u> instruct us how to deal with adversity and opposition in personal relationships. Hopefully, this does not apply to Christians within the church. Verse 21 summarizes the paragraph. What can we take to heart as believers who are increasingly dealing with adversity in our modern society? Any personal examples?

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
