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What community needs or concerns have you discussed so far?

Are there any ministries or anyone presently reaching out to these areas of need?

How could your group contribute to the efforts to help?

Are there any needs that are not being met?

What kinds of things could your group possibly do to address unmet needs?

How do you expect God to direct your decisions as to what to do and what action to take?

*Commit to pray together as a group over the next 3-4 weeks. Ask God to <u>direct your decisions</u> as a team and to <u>give you a plan</u> of how he wants you to work.

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Small Group Discussion Guide

Romans 16

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Revisit your small group project. Ask God to direct your discussion or decisions for this outreach.

- We are finishing up our study of the book of Romans. The final chapter includes a series of greetings, plus some last instructions to the church. Read <u>Romans 16:1-16</u>. Do you recognize any of the names listed? What do you suspect Phoebe was doing for Paul? What about Priscilla and Aquila? (Note <u>Acts 18:1-3, 18-19, 24-26; 1 Corinthians 16:19</u>) Apart from Mary (verse 6), all the names mentioned are Greeks, many in fact are known slaves in Rome. What else can we observe in this list?
- II. Now read <u>Romans 16:17-20</u>. What warnings does Paul give the Romans here? (Note <u>Acts 20:28-31</u>). How should we deal with divisive people in churches today? Any examples? When will God "crush Satan under your feet"?
- III. Finish by reading <u>Romans 16:21-27</u>. What can we learn from the names listed in verses 21-24? Finally, reread the doxology in verses 25-27. How does Paul describe the gospel here? How does obedience relate to belief? (Note <u>Romans 1:5, 6:16-18</u>). In what ways is God glorified forever through Jesus Christ? (Note <u>Romans 9:5</u>)

Close your group in prayer asking God to raise up workers from within your group to reach out to our community.



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
