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Small Group Discussion Guide (Week of March 15, 2020)

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to direct your study and discussion.

The recent rise of the Coronavirus has people nerved up and anxious. The media has especially focused on the negative economic, political and social fallout of the virus. Let's take a few minutes to look at our circumstances from God's perspective.

I. The Apostle Paul writes his epistle to a persecuted group of Jewish Christians during the rule of Nero, emperor of Rome. Read <u>1 Peter 3:13-17</u>. What is Peter's advice in the face of slander, difficulty and suffering? Note, three times he calls Christians to do good and avoid evil. They were to be "good citizens", in spite of some of the inequities of their day. Is the same true for us today? Explain.

II. In verse 14, we are told not to fear. Read the original text in <u>Isaiah 8:11-14</u>. According to verses 9-10, what was the context of Israel's fears. How does Isaiah address their fears? What promise does God make to them?

Now what is the context of our present fears as a nation? What threats is the virus raising in our case? What effect is panic and fear having onour society? (Notice, not all is bad.)

How should we as Christians interpret the threat of Coronavirus? According to Peter, what is our first response in the face of danger? How can faith in God thwart fear, in whatever form it appears? Any personal examples?

III. Read the following passages and affirm their truth for each of your group members. (*Psalm 91:1-16, Isaiah 12:1-6, Philippians 4:4-9, Hebrews 12:1-13*).

Discuss how this "national health crisis" could be seen as an opportunity to preach the gospel and point to God. Who do you know that fearful at present? What encouragement can we give them as Christians? Pray for just that as you close your group.

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
