Small Group Discussion Guide  
(Week of October 20, 2019)

*Begin your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to open your hearts to his truth found in the book of Ephesians.*

I. Last week we saw the opening section of Ephesians, where the Apostle Paul expounds on the many spiritual blessings we have as believers. What's one blessing from his list ([Ephesians 1:3-9](#)) that you are particularly thankful for today?

II. Did you grow up in your home "saying your prayers"? If so, share how you learned to pray. Who do you "remember in your prayers"? Read Paul's prayer for the Ephesians in [Chapter 1:15-21](#). What is Paul thankful for in verses 15-16? Who do you regularly thank God for?

III. What is Paul's request for the Ephesians in verse 17? In what ways is the Holy Spirit wise? What does the Holy Spirit reveal to people? Note ([John 16:8-15](#))

IV. Notice Paul's request in [verses 18-19](#). What does he mean by the eyes of our heart? What three things does he pray we might know? What exactly is our hope? What is our inheritance? What power is available to us?

V. Finally, according to [verses 21-22](#), where is Christ seated today and what is his relationship to us, the church? (see [Colossians 1:15-18](#)) What difference should this make in how we live as Christians on earth?
