Begin your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to use this study to show your group the importance he places on Christian unity.

I. The first half of Ephesians chapter two emphasizes the work of God in bringing salvation to the world through Jesus Christ. Next, the Apostle Paul explains the immediate implications for all who call themselves Christian. Read *Ephesians 2:11-13*. Paul is addressing Gentiles here. Who exactly are "Gentiles" and why was there Jewish opposition to them as uncircumsized foreigners"? Note (*Deuteronomy 7:1-6, Ezra 9:1-4*). According to verse 12, what hope did non-Jews have before Christ?

II. Read <u>Ephesians 2:13-18</u>. What did God do to bring both Jews and Gentiles together? According to verse 15, what did Jesus accomplish with his bodily death? Explain the law and its commands and regulations. Note (<u>Romans 7:4-6, Galatians 3:6-14</u>). Explain how the New Testament cross of Christ replaces the Old Testament law of Moses. Through Christ all believers are one before God. But what about denominations? Don't they divide Christians into groups and create hostility? Explain your answer.

III. Finally, read *Ephesians 2:19-22.* What's the good news for the "pagan Gentiles" in Ephesians 2? In what sense is the church (Christians) like a building? How does the Spirit live in us as a body of believers? How could disunity, division and strife stifle the Holy Spirit's work in a church? Any examples?

IV. We don't deal with Jews and Gentiles so much today. Apart from competing denominations, what other kinds of factions threaten to divide Christians? Read *Galatians 3:26-29*.
