Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to encourage your faith through your group study.

I. Read *Ephesians 3:1,12*. Why was Paul in jail? (Note <u>Acts 21:27-29</u>) Paul spent oer two years in prison. While there, he wrote several New Testament books, including Ephesians (*Ephesians 4:1, 6:19-20*).

II. Now read *Ephesians 3:2-6*. Paul says that the gospel is a mystery, revealed to him by God. According to verse 6, what is it? Notice how he says the same in *Colossians 1:24-27*.

III. Read <u>Ephesians 3:7-12</u>. Paul was sent beyond Judaism, to preach the gospel to the Gentiles. That's partially why he is in prison when writing this letter. He says that there are unsearchable riches in Christ. Read <u>Romans</u> <u>11:33-36</u>. How can we gain a greater appreciation and awe for the Lord and his unimaginable riches in glory?

Verse 10 says that God is working at this time through the church. What is he intending to do? Who might the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms be? (Note *Ephesians 6:12*)

IV. Finally, *Ephesians 3:12* says we all can now approach God freely. Why? How did people (the Jews) approach God before Christ? Note <u>Hebrews</u> <u>4:14-16;10:18-25.</u>

*Close your group in prayer. Thank God that he has brought you close to him through his son, Jesus Christ.

Small Group Discussion Guide (Week of November 10, 2019)

Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to encourage your faith through your group study.
