IV. There are three basic enemies of outreach: apathy, inertia and unbelief.

<u>Apathy</u> is basically the lack of concern or compassion. We know there's a need, but we really don't care enough to do something about it.

<u>Inertia</u> is kind of like negative energy or gravity that resists change. Most of us are already "so busy" and "over extended" to the point that we lack time and energy to do something else, even something as laudable as helping others. It just seems like "too much"; it's "too big", it would take "too much time or energy" to do it. So we don't!

<u>Unbelief</u> basically is an admission of doubt. I doubt whether it would make any difference. Or, I doubt whether people would be interested or responsive. Or, I doubt whether I could be of much help.

Which of these three attitudes affect you personally and why? Which of these three roadblocks to outreach are sin? As God's workmanship, people created to do good works, how do we combat these three common enemies to outreach? Could one or more of these three keep your group from being part of the upcoming Kingdom Project? Explain your answer?

Close your time by praying that God will give your group a sincere desire to do something tangible and constructive to extend his Kingdom right here in our community. Be alert to how God will begin to answer your prayer.

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Open your group with a time of sharing and prayer. Ask God to direct your group as you discuss opportunities for service in the coming year.

I. Last week, we launched off the verse of *Ephesians 2:10*. Read the verse and review exactly what God expects of us individually. Give some examples of the normal kinds of good works Christians should be doing.

II. Our 2020 objective is to see every member become a minister. Last week, we looked at weekly opportunities for service <u>within</u> the congregation (greeters, nursery help, musicians, kitchen help). Today let's think about ongoing opportunities for service <u>out in</u> our community as possible "Kingdom Projects".

List some of the parachurch ministries working in Branch County. What needs do each address? What does each ministry need to better function? (Refer to your master list as necessary)

III. Several of these community ministries have an office. Many have weekly meetings and activities. As a group, discuss the possibility of visiting one or two ministries in the coming weeks in order to better assess what they do and discern what their specific needs are.
