## Friday, December 30: Read <u>Hebrews 10</u>

The law was a foreshadow of the real thing, Jesus himself. He sets aside the old system and establishes the new way. Note the number of times the phrase "once for all" appears both in chapter 9 and chapter 10. Now we can enter God's presence with confidence, fully forgiven and holy unto God. We are instructed to stay close to God, to hold tight to our hope in him and to spur on others to do the same.

To deliberately ignore this salvation and continue in sin keeps us at odds with God. We are candidates for the final judgment of God's enemies! The Author exhorts us to persevere in spite of adversity. God will reward faithfulness in the end!

# Thru the New!

## (Reading through the New Testament in 2018)

- Invite the Holy Spirit to guide your reading each day.
- Read the chapters and underline any meaningful verses and take note of specific advise or wisdom gleaned from your reading.
- *Note any unclear passages or teaching and seek insight, answers or help.*
- Think about what you're reading. Ask:
  - 1. How does this apply to me?
  - 2. Are there any temptations to avoid, sins to confess, commands to obey or promises to claim?
  - 3. What insight do I gain on God, myself, others, or life?
- Ask God to show you any specific action you need to take as you read.

# Monday, December 3 Read <u>Hebrews 6</u>

Chapter six calls the Hebrew Christians to press on to maturity, to leave elementary teaching for deeper truths, the first of which is that Jesus cannot be re-crucified. He died once for all. An "apparent Christian" who falls away is still lost if he never truly was saved to begin with. According to verses 8-9, we should see fruit of true repentance and things that accompany salvation. Still, it is our final hope in Christ, not our works, that serves as an anchor to our soul.

# Tuesday, December 4: Read <u>Hebrews 7</u>

The superiority of Christ is now further seen through his eternal/timeless nature. Melchizedek was not a descendant of Aaron from the line of Levi. He is seen as a model for Jesus' priesthood -- not based on lineage, but on God's oath and an "indestructible life" (verse 16). As such, he guarantees a "better" covenant than the old covenant. Jesus lives forever and ever intercedes for us before the Father.

# Wednesday December 5: Read <u>Hebrews 8</u>

Again Christ is superior because his sanctuary is the authentic heavenly sanctuary and not a man made copy of it on earth. The old covenant was faulty because of sinful humanity. Jesus, the new high priest, is sinless, his promises are better than the old covenant promises. And now the law of God is internal, written with in our hearts by the Holy Spirit.

## Wednesday: Pray for Bethel Gilead Community Church

- 1. <u>Leadership</u>: Pray for God's grace and guidance in Pastor Jim and Pastor David's ministries and families. Pray for Linda Penn in her work at BGCC. Pray for the church council and the various ministry team leaders.

# Thursday, December 6: Read <u>Hebrews 9</u>

Hebrews 9 contrasts the rituals of priestly duty in the Old Testament with their counterpart fulfilled in Jesus through his ministry of redemption as the ultimate high priest. Notable in this passage is the use of his own blood (life) to cleanse our sins rather than the blood (lives) of bulls and goats. Without the shedding of blood, there is no forgiveness of sins! Unlike the Old Testament priesthood, Jesus' once and for all sacrifice has done away with sins penalty. We are free from judgment, the way to God has been opened to us once for all.
